Our income for December was \$11,882.08. Expenses totaled \$14,631.13 which is higher than October and November because we make payments for our outreach commitments during the last month of each quarter.

During the year we dipped into our general fund balance in the amount of \$7,155.99 leaving us with a general fund balance of \$3,929.72 to start off the 2015 year.

For 2014, expenses of \$152,466.94 exceeded the budget of \$150,918.00, by \$1,548.94. This amount was due to more repair expenses than planned and also due to the extreme winter we experienced last year. December of 2014 was mild but when writing this on January 7, we are adding more snow to the snow we got yesterday and it is 9 degrees outside my window. Would you please pray for mild weather and for members to be able to honor their 2015 pledges?
