Notes from the Leadership Team Meeting of September 24

The church's Mission Statement was reviewed and discussion revolved around the challenges for the church in future years. Suggested ideas were actions teams, ministering to the homeless through Interfaith Hospitality Network and E3 outposts. Pastor David noted emphasis on deepening the spiritual life of the congregation, letting the Spirit speak, and remembering Jer. 29:11 that promises "a future and a hope."

Camp Mack Stew procedures were discussed with noted awareness of documenting pertinent information should be made available as well as record keeping. Also specifics should be transferred to Ministry Teams as well as time lines for action.

Bob Kaylor representing Stewardship noted that the proposed budget has been presented and pledge cards will be received on October 4. He also addressed the need for continued funding through the **Foundation**

Fund. This funding is for the repair of the NE corner of the church building. He also stated that any contributions to this fund should not result in a lapse or decrease in pledged contributions or to capital giving. Giving could be gifts or no-interest loans to be repaid after the the present project has been accomplished.

The balance in the Foundation Fund at the end of Dec., 2014 was \$2323.84 and as of meeting date is \$3823.84. Capital and Foundation Funds are recorded separately.

Marilyn Drudge reported that the pension fund amount is now \$8,718 for 2016, adding \$553 bringing the budget total to \$151,906. She also reported that we have no "slush fund." Designated monies cannot be spent without permission from the giver(s).

John Kolb presented information and bid for rails and banisters in the pulpit area. A bid from Kevin Thomas for \$450 was accepted. They will match the valances in the sanctuary in stain and style. Additionally, \$250 is for a single banister and rails by the front door. Work will be completed by Thanksgiving. Total project cost is \$700.
