## Stewardship Report

For the first quarter of 2015 our expenses totaled \$36,402.90 and our giving totaled \$36,040.37 just \$362.53 short of matching our expenses. This is much better than last year. Our giving is not up to matching our commitment for the quarter which totaled \$38,160. Fortunately our expenses for some utilities and some repairs were a little less than

budgeted for the first quarter. Otherwise our expenses would have exceeded our giving by \$2,120.00. If you are behind in your giving because of the bad weather in February, please catch up as soon as you can.
