## Father's Day

The first celebration of Father's Day is thought to have been in July 1908 in Fairmont, W. Va. Grace Golden Clayton suggested the special observance to her pastor after a deadly explosion in a nearby town killed 361 men.

Soon after, Sonora Dodd of Spokane, WA, wanted to show her gratitude to her father, who cared for the family after his wife died. Dodd asked her pastor to choose a June Sunday to honor all fathers, and he selected June 19, 1910.

In 1924, President Coolidge suggested that Father's Day become a national holiday. In 1966, President Johnson designated the third Sunday of June to be Father's Day. President Nixon instituted Father's Day as a national observance. And now you know the rest of the story.......
