This Sunday's Forum "Kate's Kart"

Krista Layman, co-founder of **Kate's Kart** will share their story and how a tiny project has turned into a huge blessing. Kate's Kart is a not-for-profit organization that supplies free books to hospitalized children to keep



for their enjoyment. **Kate's Kart** was founded in 2008 by the Layman family in memory of their daughter, Katherine Anne Layman (affectionately known to family and friends as "Baby Kate"). In just over eight years, the organization has grown to service 16 area hospitals, plus several pediatric offices. There are currently over 100 volunteers collecting, counting, sorting, labeling, stocking and distributing books. To date, over 120,000 books have been handed out to hospitalized children.
