

Contributions for the month of December totaled \$10,627 and expenses were \$6,897 resulting in a positive balance of \$3,730. Since we started December with a negative balance of \$2,698, we actually ended the year with a positive balance of \$1,032 in the general fund. On a year-to-date basis, contributions totaled \$132,795 and expenses totaled \$135,510 for a negative balance of \$2,715 in our budget. The positive balance in the general fund happened because you rose to the challenge AND team chairs worked very hard to keep their expenses down. We are grateful for your response to our challenge budget and appreciate your support and commitment making it possible for Lincolnshire to continue doing God's work. Resolutions

American theologian Jonathan Edwards (1703-1758) became focused on his life's purpose at age 19. The result was 70 resolutions that he wrote down and then read every week for 35 years until his death. Some of these resolutions include:

- To live with all my might while I do live.
- To study the Scriptures... steadily, constantly and frequently.
- Never to lose one moment of time.
- Never to do anything which I should despise or think meanly of in another.
- Never to do anything out of revenge.
- To let there be something of benevolence in all that I speak.
- Never to do anything which I should be afraid to do if it were the last hour of my life.
