Facts about the time change for which you probably don't care...

In the U.S., clocks **change at 2:00 a.m. local time.** In spring, clocks spring forward from 1:59 a.m. to 3:00 a.m.; **in fall, clocks fall back from 1:59 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.** 2:00 a.m. was originally chosen as



the changeover time because it was practical and minimized disruption. Most people were at home and this was the time when the fewest trains were running. It is late enough to minimally affect bars and restaurants, and it prevents the day from switching to yesterday, which would be confusing. It is early enough that the entire continental U.S. switches by daybreak, and the changeover occurs before most early shift workers and early churchgoers are affected. Just remember to move your clocks back one hour on Saturday, November 4.
