Your giving contributions for November totaled \$8,927 with expenses of \$7,907. This gives us a positive balance of \$1,020. On a year-to-date basis, your contributions have totaled \$107,885 with expenses of \$78,444 with a positive balance of \$29,441. Operating on a cash basis and with some commitments paid quarterly, the monthly part of that commitment is \$1,500. Thank you for continuing to keep your pledges current which will enable us to support our new pastors. We appreciate all you do to make it possible for Lincolnshire to continue the work of God.
