Destiny Rescue is an international Christian-based non-profit organization dedicated to rescuing children from human trafficking and sexual exploitation. Aaron Brown is the National Director of Operations and works out of the US headquarters in Syracuse, IN.

Destiny Rescue believes in empowering the poor and giving them a hand up in life, not a handout. Their philosophy and goal is to help them become self-sustaining through one of their many assistance programs. Simply put, they don't want to create a welfare system where children and families become dependent on the organization, but rather have a chance to become profitable through hard work and common sense.
