We, at Lincolnshire, are on the far eastern end of the District and have little contact with our sister churches due to our location. So each month, we'll do a little "spot shot" of our sister churches. This Sunday, we highlight the Columbia City Church of the Brethren in Columbia City, IN. Here are facts about Columbia City:

Sunday school 9:00 a.m. Classes embrace nursery through adult classes. Sunday Worship is at 10:00 a.m. On Wednesdays, there is an Evening Fellowship at 6:00 with a Friendship Meal. There is also a God Squad for kids at 6:45 p.m.

In 1999, average attendance was 58 but has doubled with attendance in 2017 averaging 112. As it is at Lincolnshire, the congregation consists of "drive-in" attending which means that few attend from the immediate neighborhood but instead "drive in" from outlying neighborhoods. And as with Lincolnshire, the Columbia City family definitely feels "connected" to the church. They recently doubled the size of the church by adding a 3,727 sq addition and are using the space to better serve the needs of the congregation and the community.
