#### The repair of the northeast side of the foundation is complete.

**The Accrulevel crew** often worked in the rain on Monday, September 18, and on Tuesday, September 19, 2017, completing the work of raising the northeast corner of the church.

First the dirt along a portion of the east wall and a portion of the north wall was removed so they could check and fix, if necessary, the tile along the foundation. We were pleased to see that the tile was working and in good shape.

Then the piers with discs were augured into the soil about 20 feet down. At this point they measured the PSI of the soil resistance to insure it was adequate to raise and support the building. Heavy steel "L" brackets were attached to the piers with the other part put under the foundation.

Then huge jackets attached to the brackets were used to raise the building approximately ½ inches. Once the building was raised, a lazar scope was used to insure that it was exactly level and was raised to the exact height. Jacks were then removed, the holes filled and the dirt was then compacted. The outside crack on the east wall was filled earlier in the process and the last item completed was to fill the crack on the inside of the same wall with a special compound to strengthen and seal the wall. We were impressed with the cleanup and that they avoided tearing up the lawn.

Thanks to **Stan Gorom** for being there the entire time and for **Howard Pletcher** and **Marv Loutsenhizer** for dropping in from time to time to check on their progress and insure Accrulevel was doing excellent work. Stan, Howard and Marv all agreed that we are pleased with Accrulevel's work and that they completed their work according to the contract.

**Stan** will show slides of the work process at the September 28<sup>th</sup> Leadership Team which meets at 7:00 in the Quilters Room.



**Further work is done on the inside of the church.** Each year, the Fort Wayne Fire Department inspects the entire building for possible fire hazards. This was done in early September. This year two exit lights were noted as not working. In addition, one of the stairwells was being used for storage. These areas were rectified immediately by

Property Management.

Each year In August, all the fire extinguishers are checked to insure that they are in working condition. Any that have expired or need recharged are done on the spot by the company that specializes in that service. These functions are coordinated through the church office with cooperation from Property Management in correcting any problems. Poorman's Heating & Air will be here Monday to check a problem with a boiler blower and to make sure the system is working well for the cold winter days that lie ahead.
