## Congregational Meeting Minutes November 11, 2018

Moderator Marv Loutsenhizer opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes of Nov. 12, 2017 meeting were approved. Appointment of Trustees for 2019:

A motion to appoint the above was made by Linda Fultz and seconded by Judi Henderson. Motion passed.

#### **Annual Conference Delegates**

Conference July 3-7, 2019

Dorothy Tripp made a motion that Heather Grady be affirmed as Annual Conference delegate and Marv Loutsenhizer as alternate. Joe Henderson seconded the motion; motion passed.

Reports from Ministry Teams and Pastors were accepted and appreciation expressed for the reports and work/ministries they represent.

Security—On Sunday mornings the back door is locked at 10:15, and front door locked around 10:45.

#### Treasurer's Report--Marilyn Drudge:

As of Sept. 30, expenses exceeded giving by over \$6,300. Giving during October reversed so October's report shows giving exceeded expenses by \$2,179. Appreciation was expressed for congregation's generosity and to Leadership Team and Ministry Teams for controlling expenses.

#### **Budget—Bob Kaylor:**

Despite pledges this year being higher than last year, budget had to be adjusted down by \$8400 to match pledges. Budget as presented =\$122,488 with \$104,784 of that representing fixed costs. Additional pledges may be made and additional monies, unless designated, will be reinstated according to a priority list created by Stewardship Team. High priorities include Outreach beyond Lincolnshire, Outreach & Caring locally, and office supplies.

Motion by Bob Kaylor (for Leadership Team): Accept budget with flexibility to accept new pledges and apply according to priority list. Motion passed.

#### Continuing Education Program for Adults: Pastor Paul

Pastor Paul presented the outreach opportunity based on community need and quality of our facility to host Continuing Education for Fort Wayne Community Schools. The former computer room downstairs would be used, and program would begin with Basic Education. Later, certifications and/or ESL may be added. FWCS provides teachers, insurance, computers, Wi-Fi, plus \$200 monthly to the church. Anyone interested in helping must apply through FWCS and take special training. Motion to allow Leadership Team to continue negotiating and if satisfied, set up agreement with FWCS to begin in January was made by Judy Steckly and seconded by Tom Dawson. Motion passed.

Sara Loutsenhizer noted that outsiders "never fail" to comment on the cleanliness of the building and general appearance of church property. Thanks were expressed to Property Management Team.

It was noted that ongoing work is being done by many people to provide the range of ministries within and beyond the congregation, and "Positive progress is being made."
