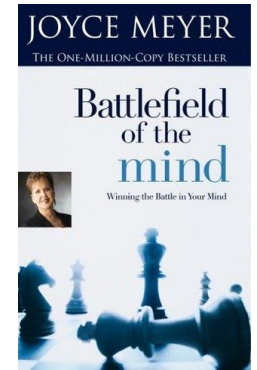

A devotional book that serves as a companion to the series is also available at the back of the sanctuary. The cost is only \$5.00.



SERMON MUSINGS

SO..what can we glean from last Sunday’s Father’s Day sermon?

First, it is important for children to have both parents in their lives, if possible. Having female and male role models help children to mature physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

Second, children whose fathers, grandfathers and even great-grandfathers who were men of commitment, competence and character (i.e. good fathers) are more likely to succeed in life.

Third, a simple hug or touch, from a parent allows you to sense your parent’s approval and love which children so desperately need.

Fourth, people are bound together by action words, such as “I Do” in marriage vows as well as when we say we accept Christ as our Lord, our commitment of faith.

Fifth, words have the **POWER** to bless and God’s Word gives us **PERMISSION** to bless such as in the Aaronic blessing from Numbers 6.
