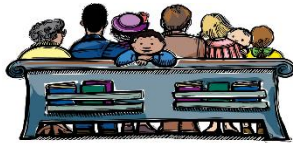

The Indiana Sign Works truck rolled in at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, August 14th and with the use of the crane on the truck, they were able to move the digital part of the sign over to the new base and place it in the base with exact precision.

The digital part of the sign is being installed. Part of the process called for the sign to be carefully lined up and secured to the new brick base with special anchors which insures that it will not be affected by rain, storms or winds.



The top part or "lip part" of the sign is installed. This part lights up at dusk and shuts off at dawn. The digital part will be programmed to turn off and come on at our specified times. We will also be able to display a variety of animations along with the text on the screen.

It was strongly felt that **Marie Clark** should be in this picture.
