

December financials have not been finalized yet but Stewardship does have November's tally done. **Contributions for November** totaled: \$8,842



Expenses for November totaled \$8,951 resulting in a negative balance of just \$109.

Year to date contributions totaled \$113,445

Year to date expenses totaled \$111,375 resulting in a positive balance of \$2,070. These figures led Stewardship to believe that we are on track for a positive year-end balance. We appreciate your support and commitment making it possible for Lincolnshire to continue doing God's work.

Sermon Summary Questions about *Heaven*January 7, 2019

Heaven is a real place filled with real people, which is why the Bible sometimes compares heaven to a mansion with many rooms (John 14: 1-3) and sometimes to an enormous city teeming with people as found in Revelation 21.

Secondly, *heaven* is the dwelling place of God. His throne, the angels, and our Lord Jesus Christ are in heaven. Philippians 3:20 says very plainly that "our citizenship is in heaven."

Third, *heaven* is not as far away as we might think. We're not that far from heaven. Heaven is not billions of light years from us.

What is heaven like? Here are 7 Biblical facts about heaven. It is...

- 1. God's dwelling place (Psalms 33:13).
- 2. Where Christ is today (Acts 1:11)
- 3. Where Christians go when they die (Philippians 1:21-23)
- 4. His Father's house (John 14:2)
- 5. A city designed and built by God (Hebrews 11:10)
- 6. A better country (Hebrews 11:16)
- 7. Paradise (Luke 23:43)

Who is in heaven right now? God is in heaven because heaven is his dwelling place. The Lord Jesus has been in heaven ever since he ascended from the earth shortly after his resurrection (Acts 1:9-11). The Bible tells us that angels are in heaven. Saints from the Old Testament, who believed in God, are in Heaven. Starting with the New Testament, everyone who has genuinely trusted in Christ as Lord and Savior will be there. I also think that children who died before the "age of accountability" go to heaven and I would also include those born with such mental limitations that they cannot understand the gospel. The Bible teaches that the moment we die we go directly into the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ.

I believe that eternal life in heaven will be even more exciting than what we have experienced here on earth. **Praise God for the next phase of our life!** ~ Pastor Paul Thomas
