

The meeting opened with devotions by Pastor Cheryl, after which minutes of April 25 were approved.

Pastors' Reports:

From the printed report, Paul highlighted visits, calls related to health concerns, Bible Studies, small groups, and language classes. Cheryl suggested options regarding rescheduling of Leadership Retreat. Decision will be made later.

Calling & Discernment—Marty Kaylor:

Copies of new Leadership Team Listing were distributed.

Outreach & Caring—Sara Loutsenhizer:

1. Hospitality is a ministry—reaching out to people. Concept of "point people" is being renewed.

2. Food Pantry options were discussed. Decision later.

Property Management—Marv Loutsenhizer:

1. Stage clean-up involved hauling away leftover items, disposing of 7 sheets of plywood, and gifting afghans to Goodwill.

2. Elevator, doors, and pulley were tested April 6. Certificate will be posted.

3. Water valve replacement was complex and costly. Matter has been resolved.

4. Bid for re-glazing six stained-glass windows is \$22,337. Estimate filed for reference. No action now.

5. Bat problem in attic: Marv moved "We negotiate a contract to close holes where bats enter at cost up to \$5,390." Motion was seconded by Judy Steckly. It was suggested Purdue Extension be contacted for estimate. Funds will come from Capital Improvement line item. Motion passed.

6. Chairs: Stan & Marv sorted metal chairs. A proposal for disposing of the dark brown chairs generated considerable discussion and will be considered at next Leadership Team meeting.

7. Policy regarding Fellowship Hall and Property Loan and Use: Marv reviewed a suggested policy for use of Fellowship Hall and noted items "that are not available for loan, personal use, or rent." Numerous suggestions were made; policy will be reconsidered at June meeting.
