

CDS (Children's Disaster Services) in preparation for the 2019 hurricane season, hosted a leadership training seminar in Indiana. In March and April, local CDS teams responded in Nebraska during the devastating floods this spring. One team served children at a shelter in Fremont, NEB., serving 50 children in 50 days. CDS has began utilizing a mapping software which offers a new way for CDS to organize responses to childcare needs after a disaster. It will make calls more efficient and provide cost-savings in the long run.

The Rebuilding Program of Brethren Disaster Ministries is involved in more than making physical repairs to damaged or destroyed homes by natural disasters. It is also about building relationships on many levels. One of the most powerful connection is between homeowners and the volunteers that work on their homes. The current Rebuilding site on the mainland is in the Carolinas. The need there after Hurricane Matthew called for an increased number of volunteers. Since May, 2018, project leaders and volunteers have gathered there, working in both Carolinas.

Powerful cyclones caused massive destruction in southern Africa. Two cyclones hit; on March 15 and on April 25. Then tropical storm Kenneth reached cyclone status destroying 35,00 homes and 45 deaths. BDM is working with a \$30,000 grant which will provide temporary shelter, relief kits and water filters. Much work needs to be done; the rebuilding of schools among the many needs.
