

New Business: Updated Plan of Organization chart was explained by Pastor Cheryl. Outreach & Caring responsibilities have been divided with Caring-Shepherding group considered an ad hoc group under Outreach. The change does not need to go before the congregation. - 3. Overflow area design was overseen by Sara Loutsenhizer, who also decorated sanctuary windows. Altar and stage decorations were designed & created by Casey Drudge.

- 5. Music & Worship goals from Leadership Retreat, including Scripture References for sermons on screen, creation of hotline, updating of children's mailboxes have been completed. Christian Ed. will decide age limit for children's gift bags.
